A motion was made by Mr. Schul, seconded by Mr. Rudolph, to approve the minutes of the October 13, 2021 regular monthly meeting. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- a. Ordinance #A-1053 Commercial Signage, 2nd reading. This will amend Chapter 94- Building Permits, adding 94.4 C, stating that all new commercial signage changes will require a permit issued by Kane Borough. Mr. Rudolph made a motion and seconded by Mr. Schul to pass Ordinance #A-1053. Motion carried.

- c. 2022 Proposed Budget, 2nd reading. This is a balanced budget with no tax increase. Mr. Schul made a motion and Mr. Scalise seconded to approve the budget. Motion carried.
